

ORAL PATHOLOGY REFRESHER. TOP 50 LESIONS IN 2 HOURS

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Course Description

Have you ever seen a lesion in a patient's mouth but were unable to provide a differential diagnosis? You probably studied oral lesions during dental hygiene school, but as with many other subjects, your memory may have faded.

Refreshing your memory about the most important oral lesions will allow you to provide better care, properly refer patients to specialists, and potentially save their lives. With the use of memory tricks, this session is fun and informative.

Lecture Method

The lecture will use WakeUp Memory™, a unique approach that creates an associative connection and makes difficult information "stick" to your brain. The technique is based on the neuroscience approach that highlights the importance of actively storing short-term memory to long-term memory.

Each lesion is paired with images, videos, and memory techniques. For example, we will remember that an ulcer is yellow in the center and has a red halo by imagining biting into a red apple. The presenter will invite the attendees to imagine biting into the red apple and getting an ulcer. This experience will stimulate all parts of the brain to maximize the learning outcome.

1. Learn how to properly describe and chart an oral lesion
2. Identify the top 50 lesions presented in the course
3. Understand the underlying conditions related to the top 50 lesions
4. Educate the patient about oral lesions
5. Differentiate potential harmful lesions from benign lesions
